

Associate Musical Director / Central London (fixed term / paid)

Pegasus invites ambitious choral conductors to apply for the role of Associate Musical Director for a 12-month placement commencing in September 2018.

Role and responsibilities

This position will provide the opportunity to gain experience working with a prestigious and active chamber choir, rehearsing a wide range of challenging music to a high standard. The intention is that the position will act as a springboard to the candidate's career as a successful choral conductor. Pegasus rehearses in Central London, where the role will be based.

The Associate Musical Director will assist the Musical Director with a range of responsibilities, including:

- Deputising for the Musical Director, or a guest conductor, to take choir rehearsals
- Accompanying rehearsals as required
- Consulting with the Musical Director and the choir committee on programming and concert venues

In the course of the placement Pegasus will endeavour to provide the Associate Musical Director with an opportunity to programme and direct a full concert performance with the choir.

Required qualities

The successful candidate will have:

- Strong experience of conducting chamber choirs, potentially gained through a master's degree in choral conducting, or demonstrated through equivalent experience
- A wide knowledge and appreciation of choral repertoire
- Strong keyboard skills
- A high degree of reliability and professionalism
- A friendly and outgoing manner

Desirable skills

The ideal candidate will also have:

- The ability to secure concert bookings for the choir
- The ability to develop the choir's membership, including attracting new recruits

The position carries a bursary of £1,500-2,000, based on the number of rehearsals and engagements attended. Expenses will be paid for any travel required to performances outside London.

About Pegasus

Pegasus, now in its 22nd season, is one of London's most acclaimed chamber choirs. Under its Musical Director, Matthew Altham, the ensemble has developed an extensive repertoire of sacred and secular music ranging from the Renaissance to the present day, including premieres of works by Thomas Adès, Francis Grier and John Tavener.

Pegasus's members are experienced singers who pursue their passion for choral music alongside varied careers. The choir presents numerous concerts each year in collaboration with charities, music societies and festivals. The choir does not rehearse weekly but holds several rehearsals or an all-day rehearsal prior to each performance. This gives the choir the flexibility to be involved in a wide range of musical projects. Pegasus performs about a dozen concerts a year.

Pegasus performs with leading instrumental ensembles, vocal soloists and conductors, and collaborates regularly with the London Handel Orchestra. In March this year, the choir took the chorus role in two performances of Handel's opera *Acis and Galatea* for the London Handel Festival, performed at St John's Smith Square with the London Handel Orchestra, conducted by Laurence Cummings and directed by Martin Parr. The choir has a long association with Tilford Bach Society, for whom our most recent concerts included J.S. Bach's *Christmas Oratorio* and *Ascension Oratorio* and Handel's *Dettingen Te Deum*. In 2017 Pegasus made its debut at London's Barbican Hall in Mahler's *Resurrection Symphony*, and last year also the choir gave the London premiere of Colin Riley's *Roads Shining Like River Up Hill After Rain*, a setting of poems of Edward Thomas for choir and cello.

Pegasus has performed in five productions with renowned dancer Carlos Acosta at the London Coliseum. the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden, and the Royal Albert Hall. The ensemble has featured on BBC television and radio, Channel 4 and Classic FM. In 2013 Pegasus won the chamber choir prize at the Florilège Vocal de Tours International Choral Competition in France, along with a special award for its performance of the music of Francis Poulenc. The choir was a prize-winner at the 2007 Tolosa International Choral Competition in Spain, and a semi-finalist in the BBC Choir of the Year competition in 2005.
